


The Village Of Swansea Partners With Architectural Design Team To Create Old Town Swansea Streetscape Masterplan

In March, the Village Board conducted a Qualification Based Selection process to select a firm to create a Masterplan for the area generally referred to as "Old Town" Swansea. As a result of this selection process the Village has partnered with the top ranked team, which is led by PGAV Planners, LLC. The team includes staff from PGAV, engineering firm Thouvenot, Wade, and Moerchen, conservation organization Heartlands Conservancy, and marketing firm Novella.

The purpose of the Old Town Swansea Streetscape Master Plan is to bring together the public, community stakeholders, and experts to re-envision the use of public space in Old Town Swansea. This shared vision will be presented in a document that will guide the implementation of the projects and ideas generated throughout the participatory process. The project will recommend ways to enhance the identity of Old Town through place making and streetscape design, enhance connectivity throughout the area, especially between Old Town, the Foundry District, the Brickyard District, bike trails, Swansea Creek, and the MetroLink station, improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, enrich resident and visitor experience, assess parking usage, and address residential concerns. This plan will focus primarily on streetscape design to re-envision the use of public space in Old Town Swansea. The goal of this plan is to serve as a catalyst for economic development within the Old Town area by improving multi-modal access to and within the area.

The Streetscape Master Plan effort builds on priorities and recommendations generated through prior planning processes, including the 2017 Comprehensive Plan update, the 2012 Explore

Government Center Closed Monday May 27th Refuse & Recycling Collection Also Affected on May 27th

The Swansea Government Center and all non-emergency services of the Village will be closed on Monday, May 27th for the Memorial Day holiday.

Republic Services will observe Memorial Day on Monday, May 27th as a holiday as well.

The collection of refuse and recyclables will shift one day for all routes, with Monday's refuse and recyclables picked up on Tuesday, Tuesday's picked up on Wednesday, Wednesday's on Thursday, Thursday's on Friday, and Friday's on Saturday instead. Yard waste collection will move from Thursday to Friday.

Annual Refuse Stickers Now Available At Government Center

While most residents buy the regular stickers under the Village's solid waste program for collection of the refuse in one 33 gallon container, some would rather not have to deal

with those stickers on a weekly basis. Residents therefore also have the option of buying an annual sticker instead, at a price of \$237.56 for the full year. The annual sticker is permanently affixed to one 33 gallon refuse container, and unlike the weekly stickers, is not removed by the collector. Instead it stays attached during the year and allows the collection and disposal of one container of refuse per week for all 52 weeks of the year.

While maybe more convenient to the resident, there is a slight cost differential for not having to buy stickers during the year. Fifty-two weekly stickers at \$4.32 each have the equivalent annual cost of \$224.64, so the annual sticker adds \$12.92 to your cost of refuse collection.

However, for some that added cost might be worth the time saved in buying stickers regularly. The price of annual stickers is reduced on a pro rata basis each week during the year until the stickers expire on April 30, 2020. That way, someone purchasing an annual sticker after May 1 only pays for that portion of the year they actually have the service.



Every Business and Non-Residential Use of Property Must Be Registered By May 1st

Under the requirements of the Swansea Zoning Code, every business, service occupation and home occupation - collectively known as non-residential uses - must register annually with the Village. This regulation helps ensure that all such uses are properly lawful in the zoning districts within which they operate.

The process also identifies those businesses that are required to pay sales tax, so that the Village has a database of such businesses against which it can verify tax payer information provided by the state. Since Swansea shares zip codes with other communities, in the past revenue that belongs to Swansea was erroneously paid by the State to neighboring communities - one reason that the Village

strongly recommends that businesses clearly list their location as being in the Village of Swansea.

All businesses and organizations who have completed the form in the past, have been sent a new one in the mail to the address on record, and should have filed that new form and paid the \$35 fee prior to April 22nd.

However, any new business enterprise or organization that initiated operations within the Village in the last year, or

which has not previously registered with the Village, must either contact the Swansea Government Center to secure and submit an application, or download the form from the Village website at www.swanseail.org, and complete and return it to the Government Center with the required fee.

The annual fee was only \$35.00 for this registration, but late registration increases that fee to \$110.00 (\$35.00 + \$75.00).



Burning of Landscape Waste Ending May 15th

Swansea ordinances restrict the burning of landscape waste to specific time frames in Spring and Fall. For 2019 the Spring 'burn' season begins March 15th and ends May 15th. Residents who choose to do so may burn landscape waste only on Wednesdays and Saturdays between those dates, and only between the hours of 9:00am and 6:00pm. Fires should be manned at all times and burning should be avoided on windy days. All the conditions for doing so are contained in the ordinance on the Village's website at www.Swanseail.org.



Burning will presume in the Fall of 2019 beginning November 1st and ending December 15th on Wednesdays and Saturdays only between the hours of 9:00am to 4:00pm.

Swansea plan, and the Urban Land Institute's Technical Assistance Panel regarding transit-oriented development at MetroLink stations. Common themes throughout these three planning efforts include a desire for better multi-modal connectivity, interest in integrating the MetroLink station with nearby development, and improving safety for residents and visitors traveling on foot or by bike. The update to the Village's Comprehensive Plan in 2017 recommended capitalizing on the aspects of Swansea that residents love most: safe neighborhoods, good highway access, extensive bike and walking trails, and access to the MetroLink Station. Explore Swansea, completed by Heartlands Conservancy in 2012, addressed several recommendations from the Comprehensive Plan related to bicycle and pedestrian connectivity and safety. Survey results communicated an overwhelming desire from residents to support alternative modes of transportation and

safer bike and pedestrian connectivity. Heartlands Conservancy engaged the public through open houses, various surveys, and a walking workshop. The team's approach for the Masterplan includes in-person engagement with residents, online surveys, social media coverage, and educational pop-up programming. The recently completed Urban Land Institute Technical Assistance Panel addressed development opportunities around the MetroLink Station and recommended the creation of a Master Plan that focuses on connectivity and safety for bicyclist and pedestrian traffic. The focus of the Masterplan centers on the entirety of the Old Town area with special consideration given to the streets and trails around the MetroLink Station.

In the next few weeks an engagement website will become available and updates on the Masterplan process will be posted on the Swansea Community and Economic Development Facebook page.

Swansea offers a senior van service that runs Tues., Wed. and Thurs. To utilize this service, one must be a Swansea resident, 60+ or disabled. Riders should call the Government Center at 234-0044 the day prior by 2:00pm to schedule a ride.

Scheduling:

- Riders must call the day before by 2:00 pm to schedule a ride (Monday for Tuesday etc.).
- Be prepared to provide name, address, and a working phone number.
- Riders must provide the name, address including suite #, and apt time for their destination.
- Riders may only request 2 destinations per day.
- 6 rider's maximum per day.
- Riders must be reachable by phone from 2 pm till pickup for time adjustments.

- Medical appointments supersede all other requests.
- Rider will be given a card with return trip phone (618) 779-5521.
- The van doesn't go out on holidays or the day after.
- The van is not equipped for wheelchairs or motorized carts.

Riders:

- Riders are expected to be mobile and able to enter and exit the van without help.
- NO smoking, vaping or eating on the van. No weapons.
- Rider are expected to be ready 15 minutes prior to and at their door for pickup.
- If the van does not arrive 15 minutes AFTER your pickup time call 779-5521 for an update.
- Riders that are shopping will be given a pickup time and need to be ready and waiting. Must be willing to help with loading and unloading of packages.
- Failure to cancel a scheduled trip or be a no-show will result in loss of service. (2 warnings only)
- Riders must maintain an acceptable standard of personal hygiene.
- Service animals are allowed for person with disabilities.

Drivers:

- Driver cannot go into appointments with riders.
- Drivers cannot enter private residences or lock and unlock doors.
- Drivers are only authorized to pick up and drop off at location on schedule.
- Drivers are not permitted to lose sight of van. So for apartment building all packages will be left at main door.
- Drivers will use his/her discretion to judge if a person is incapable of being transported safely.
- Drivers can cancel all appointment due to bad weather. Riders will be notified by phone.



Spring Rains Always Bring The Potential For Flooding

Spring in Swansea means the grass is growing, flowers are blooming, and rain is falling. While heavy rain and flooding occur during any season of the year, most of the major floods in our area have occurred during the spring and fall rains. And while only about 60 acres in the Village of Swansea are within the regulated floodplain, many other areas outside the designated floodplain are also susceptible to flooding.

So the Village wants to remind its residents of a few safety tips relating to flooding:

Do not walk through flood waters. Currents are deceptive. Six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet. If you must walk, use a stick to test that ground remains under the water ahead of you.

Do not drive through a flooded area. More people drown in their cars than anywhere else.

Do not drive around barriers, as the road or bridge may be washed out.

Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. The number two flood killer after drowning is electrocution. Report downed power lines to the power company or 911.

Turn off all electrical circuits and gas lines that may come in contact with flood water.

Residents of Swansea can help minimize flooding and the resulting damage by checking with the Building and Zoning Department prior to building on, altering, grading, or placing fill on your property. A permit may be required to ensure that a project is compliant with all codes. Report any suspected illegal building, filling, or dumping to the Village at 618-234-0044.

If your house has flooded in the past or you fear that it may flood in the future, talk to the Village about protecting your house or business. There may be ways to modify your building to minimize flood damage.

Where flooding tends to be shallow, measures such as small floodwalls,

regrading the yard, and flood proofing the walls or utilities can be relatively inexpensive. Where flooding is deep, a building may need to be elevated. Again, be sure to check if permits are required before performing any work.

Even if you're not in the mapped floodplain, your property may be subject to flooding from local drainage. In either case, flood insurance may be a good investment because most homeowners insurance policies do not cover damage caused by surface water flooding. 
News Briefs

Patrick moved to Swansea in 2004 and attended school at Wolf Branch Elementary, Wolf Branch Middle School and Belleville Township High School East. Patrick has been on the Honor Roll since

7th grade and is a member of the National Honor Society, the English Honor Society, the Science Honor Society and the German Honor Society of which he is the President. Patrick is an active member of the Boy Scouts of America, Troop 52, attaining the rank of Eagle Scout in 2015 and being named Eagle Scout of the Year with a class of 164 Eagle Scouts. He has served four years as a National Youth Leadership Training Instructor and attended several national high adventure events including Philmont where he was the Crew Leader for a 12 day, 121 mile expedition in the mountains of New Mexico. 


