REFERENCE THE COMMUNITY CALENDARS ON PAGES 10 & 11 TO REFERENCE EVENTS, IMPORTANT DATES AND MEETINGS.

On December 21st, the Village Board passed an ordinance establishing tax levies for all corporate purposes to be levied against all property subject to taxation within the Village for the purpose of providing funds for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2021 and ending April 30th, 2022. Despite enduring a financially challenging year, the Village Board and staff worked diligently to ensure only a moderate increase for 2021/22. With total funds levied coming to just under \$2.25 million, residents will only see an increase that is below 5%. Following recommendations from its actuarial reports, the Village has levied an additional \$85,000 for its first responders, while keeping most other categories relatively flat.

Continuing a four-year tradition, just under \$27,000 are levied specifically for public parks. These funds are intended to be used only for capital expenditures improving the parks, not for operations. With the recent acquisition of the Clinton Hills Conservation Park, those funds are greatly needed.

Even in a year of significant downturns across multiple sectors, the Village was able to attract new restaurants, new retail, and even a big box store expansion. Further investments in our corridor infrastructure will foster similar growth in coming years. As elected officials and staff continue to tighten budgets where possible, they are ever vigilant in identifying and encouraging new revenue streams to assist in the cost of providing the excellent public services you've come to expect.

10 Shared Principles

Almost a year ago Pastor Monty Weatherall from Love Church in Swansea and Police Chief Steve Johnson started meeting and talking about nationwide events in law enforcement. Both were troubled by the events and the response from the news media and the public. These discussions were not directly related to local events in town but both understood it could have a trickle down effect on perceptions. The discussions were about understanding all walks of life and how different people see things differently. They hatched the idea of starting the first ever Swansea Cultural Working Group:

Pastor Monty Weatherall; Kendrick Bell – teacher/lives in Swansea; Police Commissioner Ranodore Foggs; Brandon Crisp – Swansea business owner; Mayor Mike Leopold; Deputy Chief Matt Blomberg and Chief Steve Johnson.

With support from the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), NAACP and McKendree University SJEC (Social Justice and Equity Committee) the Working Group had many discussions about social justice, modern day law enforcement, best practices and just getting a better understanding of what was really going on. Through the dialog, the concept of the Ten Shared Principles was introduced. Some meetings entailed detailed discussions about each and every point. The Ten Shared Principles was originally designed by the IACP and the NAACP in 2018 but we wanted to tailor it specific to the Swansea community and what made sense to all of us. The Working Group decided it was important to Swansea citizens to advertise the work that was done on the important document. The 800 member Illinois City/County Management Association Board of Directors and 250 police departments in the State of Illinois had voted to endorse them. On November 16th, 2020 the Swansea Cultural Working Group signed the Ten Shared Principles in front of the Swansea Board of Trustees. The Trustees then passed it as a resolution for the entire community. It is forever now part of our culture and what we do.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE TEN SHARED PRINCIPLES AGREED TO BY THE NAACP ILLINOIS STATE CONFERENCE, THE ILLINOIS ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE AND THE SWANSEA CULTURAL WORKING GROUP

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2018, the NAACP Illinois State Conference and the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police agreed to 10 Shared Principles designed to build trust between law enforcement and communities of color, and;

WHEREAS, the two statewide associations vowed “by mutual affirmation to work together and stand together in our communities and at the state level to implement these values and principles, and to replace mistrust with mutual trust wherever, whenever, and however can,”

WHEREAS, the Swansea Police Department adopts these same Ten Shared Principles as their own, and thereby add its name to the historic agreement between the Illinois NAACP and the IACP. These are the Ten Shared Principles:

1. We value the life of every person and consider life to be the highest value.
 2. All persons should be treated with dignity and respect. This is another foundational value.
 3. We reject discrimination toward any person that is based on race, ethnicity, religion, color, nationality, immigrant status, sexual orientation, gender, disability, or familial status,
 4. We endorse the six pillars in the report of the President’s Task Force on 21st Century Policing. The first pillar is to build and rebuild trust through procedural justice, transparency, accountability, and honest recognition of past and present obstacles.
 5. We endorse the four pillars of procedural justice, which are fairness, voice (i.e., an opportunity for citizens and police to believe they are heard), transparency, and impartiality.
 6. We endorse the values inherent in community policing, which includes community partnerships involving law enforcement, engagement of police officers with residents outside of interaction specific to enforcement of laws, and problem-solving that is collaborative, not one-sided.
 7. We believe that developing strong ongoing relationships between law enforcement and communities of color at the leadership level and street level will be the keys to diminishing and eliminating racial tension.
 8. We believe that law enforcement and community leaders have a mutual responsibility to encourage all citizens to gain a better understanding and knowledge of the law to assist them in their interactions with law enforcement officers.
 9. We support diversity in police departments and in the law enforcement profession. Law enforcement and communities have a mutual responsibility and should work together to make a concerted effort to recruit diverse police departments.
 10. We believe de-escalation training should be required to ensure the safety of community members and officers. We endorse using de-escalation tactics to reduce the potential for confrontations that endanger law enforcement officers and community members; and the principle that human life should be taken on as a last resort.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF SWANSEA, ILLINOIS on the 16th of November, 2020 adopts the Ten Shared Principles as agreed to by the NAACP Illinois State Conference, the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police and the Swansea Cultural Working Group.

Designated Snow Routes for the Village of Swansea

When it snows, it's a good idea to move all vehicles off Village streets before snow plows come through. Not doing so will hamper the Village's ability to effectively clear the streets.

However, there are streets in the Village specifically designated as snow routes. Section 72.40 (A) of the Swansea Municipal Codes states: "Within the village, whenever there is an accumulation of three inches or more of snow, no person, firm, or corporation shall park or allow any motor vehicle to remain parked, on any designated snow route ...for a period of 24 hours following said accumulation, or until said route has been sufficiently cleared of snow."

There is a very logical reason for this regulation. Designated snow routes are those primary arterials for moving traffic in or out of residential areas and as such they are cleared first to make it easier for you to get to or from your

home. The Village needs to do so as quickly as possible-without having to navigate around parked vehicles- in order to move on to residential streets that don't carry as much traffic.

Big Bend Blvd.: Bettina Dr. to Leawood Dr.

Bobbie Dr.: Castle Dr. to Brian Dr.

Brian Dr.: Bobbie Dr. to Mary Jo Dr.

Caseyville Ave.: Gilbert St. to North Belt West

Castle Ct.: Route 161 to Castle Dr.

Castle Dr.: Castle Ct. to Bobbie Dr.

Creekside Ct.: Creekside Dr. to Old Collinsville Rd.

Fawn Meadows: Lake Lorraine Dr. to Old Collinsville Rd.

Fournie Dr.: Mary Jo Dr. to Josephine Dr.

Fullerton Road: Rte 161 to Rte 159



If Your Sewer System Backs Up, Call The Village First

A friendly reminder to residents: call the Village first if your sewer system starts to backup.

Because storm water can infiltrate the sanitary sewer system during periods of heavy rain, that additional water can overload the system and cause it to slow down or backup. It generally will do so into low lying basements. Residents who have experienced that before probably recognize the signs, or have installed a check valve to prevent backups.

On non-holidays, Mon - Fri, 8:00am - 4:30pm, call 234-0044, and Government Center staff will dispatch Public Works. After hours and on weekends, call 233-8114. A police dispatcher will answer, but explain that you need Public Works to respond to a sewer backup and they will route your call or message.

CHIEF'S CORNER

Police Offer Tips On Locking Vehicles

The Swansea Police Department is reminding residents to lock vehicles left outside overnight. Auto burglary is usually a crime of opportunity, so if you can, park your car in a garage, and check to make sure your garage door is down and secured at night before you go to bed.

But if you must park outside, do so in your driveway or in a well-lit area away from places of concealment, such as an alley or behind bushes. Double check that all windows are closed and your doors are locked. Most burglars simply walk along a street and check all cars for an unlocked door. If yours are locked, most burglars move on to easier prey. But also remember to take your wallet, cell phone and other valuables with you when you leave your car. When those items are in sight, a burglar may break a window to get to them in a locked vehicle.

Don't leave a spare key in the car (it happens), and don't hide a key in one of those magnetic key boxes. If it is in an easily reachable spot for you, a burglar could find it as well. It is also a good idea to not attach personal info to your keys in case they are lost or stolen. Car alarms remain an effective deterrent to a burglar so consider getting one if you must always park outside.

It is OK to be a nosy neighbor and call Swansea Police Department the second you see something suspicious happening in your neighborhood. Call the police! They don't mind. It is their job.

Government Center Closed For The Following Holidays Listed Below Refuse Collection Also Delayed For Some Holidays

The Swansea Government Center and all non-emergency services of the Village will be closed on the following holiday's:

JANUARY:

Fri., Jan 1st in observance of New Years Day, and on Monday January 18th, in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day. New Year's Day holiday will also affect trash and recycling collection for residents. Those with a normal collection day on Friday, will have collection on Saturday instead. Yard waste collection will

not be affected. The last day for yard waste for the year before it starts back up in April will be Thur., Dec 31st.

Christmas Tree Collection

Christmas trees can be dropped off at Melvin Price Park and Schranz Park until January 17, Village staff will collect them until then. This is a convenience provided to Swansea residents only. No tree bags. Christmas trees only; no yard waste.

Republic's Christmas Tree Collection:

If a resident is subscribed to the yard waste collection service, they can sit out Christmas trees on their yard waste day from January 4th—15th, at no charge. If a resident is not subscribed to the yard waste service, we will pick up their trees on their normal trash day from January 4th-15th., but they will need to put 1 sticker on them. If they have yard waste service it will be on Thursdays, but if they don't, it would be on their normal trash day

Important Information From The Swansea Police Department

Reporting Unemployment Insurance Fraud – from the Swansea Police Department

Identity thieves and hackers have long known how to use stolen identities to commit fraud – for example, to open a new credit card or file a false tax return – and criminals using stolen identities to defraud public assistance programs is not new. In fact, such schemes are so pervasive that federal rules require Illinois to have staff dedicated to preventing and stopping fraudulent activity in the Unemployment Insurance (UI) system.

Please take the time to review the information below, including how to spot UI identity theft, how to report identity theft to IDES, and what happens after you contact the agency.

How can I spot unemployment insurance identity theft?

- You receive a debit card or an unemployment insurance letter (UI Finding) and have not filed a claim for benefits.

- You are notified by your employer that a claim for benefits has been filed when you have not been separated from employment.
- You attempt to file a claim online and one already exists.
- You receive IRS correspondence regarding unreported UI benefits.
- You receive notice of a state or federal tax offset.

What steps should I take if I receive a debit card or a UI Finding letter, and did not file for unemployment benefits?

If you suspect a claim has been submitted using your information, and you have not applied for unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois, take steps as follows:

- ⇒ CONTACT IDES at (800) 814-0513 TO REPORT WHAT YOU RECEIVED
- ⇒ Select English or Spanish language option;
- ⇒ Select option #1 for claimants, and;

⇒ Select option #5 to report identity theft.

DO NOT activate the debit card that was mailed to you.

DO NOT contact KeyBank.



Winter Holiday Safety From The Swansea Fire Department

Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together.

But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

Holiday decorating

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.

Holiday Entertaining

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.

Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.


