Village Board Adopts Property Tax Levy For Fiscal Year 2023

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REFERENCE THE COMMUNITY CALENDARS ON PAGE 11 TO REFERENCE EVENTS, IMPORTANT DATES AND MEETINGS.

On December 5, 2022, the Village Board passed an ordinance establishing tax levies for all corporate purposes to be levied against all property subject to taxation within the Village for the purpose of providing funds for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2023 and ending April 30, 2024. While many municipalities have faced financial challenges arising from the recent pandemic, Swanssea remains in a strong financial position for the future. Total funds levied come to just under \$2.4 million. As always, levied funds for Fire and Police Pensions come directly from Village actuarial reports.

The following is a listing of all property taxes to be levied by the Village of Swanssea for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2023 and ending April 30, 2024.

Designated Snow Routes for the Village of Swansea



When it snows, it's a good idea to move all vehicles off Village streets before snow plows come through. Not doing so will hamper the Village's ability to effectively clear the streets. However, there are streets in the Village specifically designated as snow routes. Section 72.40 (A) of the Swansea Municipal Codes states: "Within the village, whenever there is an accumulation of three inches or more of snow, no person, firm, or corporation shall park or allow any motor vehicle to remain parked, on any designated snow route ...for a period of 24 hours following said accumulation, or until said route has been sufficiently cleared of snow." There is a very logical reason for this regulation. Designated snow routes are those primary arterials for moving traffic in or out of residential areas and as such they are cleared first to make it easier for you to get to or from your home. The Village needs to do so as quickly as possible - without having to navigate around parked vehicles to move on to residential streets that don't carry as much traffic.


If Your Sewer System Backs Up, Call The Village First

A friendly reminder to residents: call the Village first if your sewer system starts to backup. Because storm water can infiltrate the sanitary sewer system during periods of heavy rain, that additional water can overload the system and cause it to slow down or backup. It generally will do so into low lying basements. Residents who have experienced that before probably recognize the signs, or have installed a check valve to prevent backups. On non-holidays, Mon - Fri, 8:00am - 4:30pm, call 234-0044, and Government Center staff will dispatch Public Works. After hours and on weekends, call 233-8114. A police dispatcher will answer, but explain that you need Public Works to respond to a sewer backup and they will route your call or message.



Republic's Christmas Tree Collection

If a resident is subscribed to the yard waste collection service, they can sit out Christmas trees on their yard waste day of Thursday from January 2nd — 13th, at no charge. If a resident is not subscribed to the yard waste service, we will pick up their trees on their normal trash day from January 2nd — 13th, but they will need to put 1 sticker on them.

⇒ **Inspections and Reinspections:** Must be paid 48 hours in advance. You can drop payment off in the drop off box located outside by the flag pole or come in the office. Please call our office at 618-234-0044 to schedule and for pricing.

⇒ **Occupancy Permits:** New residents must obtain an occupancy permit before occupying the home. Must provide copy of lease/contract and copy of your photo ID for \$30

⇒ **Copy Of Permit:** Need photo ID for \$10 and **Modified Occupancy Permit:** If renting, must provide copy of updated lease and copy of your photo ID or just your ID if you own the home for \$20

⇒ **Building Permits:** If you are having work done at your property in Swansea please call the Government Center at (618) 234-0044 to see if the work requires a permit. If you are having a contractor do work at your home and or property make sure they have a permit before starting the work. Inspections are also required for any permit that is issued.

⇒ **Refuse Container:** Shall be removed as soon as possible but, no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of collection.

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Police Department Promotions

Chief Blomberg joined the Swansea Police Department in 1999. He graduated from the Belleville Area College (now Southwestern Illinois College) Police Academy Session 72. Upon graduation, he was assigned to patrol, where he received numerous awards for DUI enforcement. In 2004, he completed Basic SWAT School at the Springfield, IL Police Academy and later joined the St. Clair County Regional Special Response Team in 2010. Chief Blomberg was promoted to sergeant in 2007 and served as a Patrol Commander as well as completed his tour with the St. Clair County SRT as a Team Leader. In January 2020, Chief Blomberg was promoted to Deputy Chief of Police.

During his career, Chief Blomberg served the department as a PPCT Defensive Tactics Instructor, Taser Instructor, Firearms Instructor, Field Training Officer, Active Shooter Instructor, Law Enforcement Supply Office (LESO) Coordinator, Internship Director, and Operations Commander. He also served on the ILEAS Mobile Field Force where he finished his assignment as a Team Leader.

Chief Blomberg grew up in Belleville in the 1980s while his family was stationed at Scott Air Force Base. He attended Tufts University in Medford, MA where he graduated with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Psychology in 1995. In 2016, he graduated from the Illinois Law Enforcement and Training Board Executive Institute for Police Executive Role in the 21st Century and also attended the Executive Summit for Managing the Small Law Enforcement Agency. Chief Blomberg attended the FBI National Academy Session 283 in Quantico, VA from which he graduated in September 2022. He is currently pursuing his Master's in Public Safety degree through the University of Virginia. Chief Blomberg has been married since 1998 and has a son and daughter.



Deputy Chief Keith Howard joined the Swansea Police Department in 2007 after serving five years in the United States Marine Corps, including a deployment for Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003.

Howard, upon joining the department in 2007, was assigned to the patrol division for approximately two years. Howard was selected to represent the department in the Metropolitan Enforcement Group of Southwestern Illinois (MEGSI), as an undercover narcotics detective, from 2009-2012. After completing three years in MEGSI, Howard returned to the department in the patrol division for approximately one year.

Howard was chosen to become a detective in 2014, where he was also member of the Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis. In August 2014, Howard was promoted to Sergeant, where he rejoined the patrol division as a shift supervisor until he was promoted to Deputy Chief of Police in November 2022.

During his tenure at the department, Deputy Chief Howard has and continues to serve as the Range Master for the department. Howard is a state certified pistol, rifle, shotgun and Taser instructor. Howard is the Range Master for the Southwestern Illinois College Police Academy and a firearms instructor for the Southwestern Illinois Law Enforcement Commission (SILEC). Howard is a Colt certified 1911 armorer, AR-15/M-16 armorer, Springfield Armory armorer, Smith and Wesson armorer and a Glock armorer. Howard is a certified active shooter instructor, Simunitions instructor, Reality Based Use of Force Instructor, Force Science DeEscalation Instructor and a Field Training Officer (FTO).

Deputy Chief Howard has a B.S. degree in Criminal Justice from Lindenwood College and an A.A.S. degree in Administration of Justice from Southwestern Illinois College. Howard has completed the Police Mid-Management Role in the 21st Century. Lastly, Howard graduated from Northwestern Center for Public Safety School of Police Staff and Command (Class 515).



Village Of Swansea Residents With Ameren Protected From Rising Energy Costs

Many of our residents have expressed concerns about the recent rising costs of electric supply rates. Thanks to the foresight of The Village of Swansea leadership, and through their energy consultant, Good Energy, the residents located in the Village limits who are serviced from Ameren Illinois are protected from the increasing costs of electric supply. Along with several other local communities and townships, The Village of Swansea joined the municipal aggregation program nearly 10 years ago. The program has been successful over the years, saving residents money on their electric bill. However, it's never been more successful than it is currently. With today's volatility in the energy market, prices have skyrocketed, and if not for the aggregation, the residents would have no choice but to receive its power supply rate from Ameren. In May of this year, Ameren filed

its latest rate increase with the Illinois Commerce Commission, and since that time has had to readjust those rates two additional times to the current rate. Rates starting in June 2022 were \$0.10628 per kilowatt used, then beginning in October 2022 through May of 2023 the rate increased to \$0.1236 per kilowatt used. These rates are more than double the current Village's aggregation rate of \$0.05048 per kilowatt, which equates to well over a \$0.07 savings per kilowatt. The average homeowner using 800 kilowatts per month will save roughly \$56.00 - \$65.00 per month, or \$700.00 per year on the low end. The average number of 800 kilowatts is a very conservative number, as it equates to a smaller home with less than 3 residents. Larger homes with bigger families will save upwards of nearly twice those forecasted savings, based on kilowatt usage. While ultimately

cost savings are a desired outcome from the program, the real purpose of aggregations is to protect the customer from the volatility in the marketplace and to stabilize cost with fixed pricing. Most residents (over 90%) of eligible homes for the aggregation program in Swansea are in the program unless they have opted out. Residents can check their participation by looking at their Ameren bill under the supply portion. It should list Homefield Energy as the supplier in a "municipal aggregation program". If residents are not currently enrolled, they can simply call Homefield at 866-694-1262 or go to their website at Homefieldenergy.com to enroll. Small businesses who use less than 15,000 annually also qualify for the \$0.05048 rate, and their current Ameren commercial rate is even higher, at over \$0.1400 per kilowatt.

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
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Swansea Rotary CAVE Educational Awards Raffle

THE CHAD WOOD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Rotary Club of Swansea annually sponsors scholarships for area high school seniors.

In 2023, three \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded.

Swansea Residency Requirements --The Chad Wood Memorial Scholarship Competition is open to all graduating high school students who currently reside in the Village of Swansea, Illinois, at the time of the March 20, 2023 application deadline, and/or who have resided in the Village of Swansea for at least three of the past five years immediately prior to the March 20, 2023 application deadline. Students who expect to graduate from Althoff Catholic High School; Belleville East; Belleville West; Governor French Academy; private or parochial schools in Madison County or St. Clair County, IL; St. Louis City or St. Louis County (MO), and who satisfy the residency requirements as above stated, are eligible, subject to the following qualifications:

The applicant must be a person of good moral character who has demonstrated a commitment to the concept of community service and volunteerism.

The applicant will submit an essay of 350-500 words on a subject related to Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self."

The applicant will have attained a GPA of 3.0+ at the time of application (if school is on a 4.0 basis) or 4.0+ (if on a 5.0 basis).

The applicant will submit at least one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, clergy member, or other unrelated adult who knows your interests, work habits and capabilities.

The applications should be submitted by mail, not later than March 20, 2023. The envelope must bear a postmark date of March 20, 2023 or earlier.

Application must be complete at the time of receipt. Failure to follow instructions and/or an incomplete application will not be considered.

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

Police Offer Tips on Locking Vehicles

The Swansea Police Department is reminding residents to lock vehicles left outside overnight. Auto burglary is usually a crime of opportunity, so if you can, park your car in a garage, and check to make sure your garage door is down and secured at night before you go to bed. But if you must park outside, do so in your driveway or in a well-lit area away from places of concealment, such as an alley or behind bushes. Double check that all windows are closed and your doors are locked. Most burglars simply walk along a street and check all cars for an unlocked door. If yours are locked, most burglars move on to easier prey. But also remember to take your wallet, cell phone and other valuables with you when you leave your car. When those items are in sight, a burglar may break a window to get to them in a locked vehicle. Don't leave a spare key in the car (it happens), and don't hide a key in one of those magnetic key boxes. If it is in an easily reachable spot for you, a burglar could find it as well. It is also a good idea to not attach personal info to your keys in case they are lost or stolen. Car alarms remain an effective deterrent to a burglar so consider getting one if you must always park outside.
