Public Hearing For Codification of Municipal Ordinances Expected in Sept

The process of rewriting and reorganizing the Swansea Municipal Code is nearly complete. Under the guidance of Judiciary Committee Chair Brian Wells, the Village has reviewed all of its municipal laws, rewritten those that needed clarification and then turned the entire document over to American Legal Publishing who reviewed for any internal incongruity, and for compliance with State and Federal laws.

American Legal Publishing then revised the Village's draft and reordered the Village's laws into a new format and coding system. That second draft has been reviewed, and final changes are now being made.

The Village expects that during the month of September it should be ready to hold a public hearing related to the codified ordinances. A link to the American Legal Publishing website will be provided on the Village's website so residents can link to and review any of the changes that have been made. Residents will be able to comment on any of those changes.

After the Public Hearing, the Village will adopt the final codified code by ordinance. After it does so, that new ordinance in essence replaces any of the previous ordinances that created or amended the previous code book.

Proposed Boul Ave Trail In Swansea Selected For Federal TAP Funding

The Village of Swansea received notice on August 7th that its grant application for the Boul Avenue Trail project had been selected for funding under the federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). Over the years the Federal Government has continually tweaked its programs and efforts towards funding alternatives to vehicular transportation.

Wishing to influence local governments to invest in alternatives such as on-road or off-road bicycle and pedestrian trails and walkways, a number of grant programs have been offered. In 2012 a program entitled Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), replaced a previous program with TAP and consolidated most of the activities previously funded under that previous program with the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program.

Following a block grant format, \$1.4 million in funding was allocated to Illinois and Swansea's project was one of only six in the state selected from a total of fifteen applications, and designated for funding.

The Boul Avenue Trail project would create a new multi-purpose trail along the northern edge of Boul Avenue, running from a point near High Mount School to the property at the rear of the Cholula's Mexican Restaurant on IL 159. That property to the rear is currently owned by the St. Clair

County Transit District. Project concepts call for the property to become a new trailhead park, where area residents could park a vehicle and have direct access to the MetroBikeLink Trail.



The Boul Avenue trail would therefore connect to the MetroBikeLink Trail, through the new park and westward along Boul to High Mount School. A mid-block crossing over Boul Avenue would also connect the new trail to the current trail between Boul Avenue and Melvin Price Memorial Park. This would serve two purposes: provide a safer route for High Mount students who use that route to walk to and from school, or to and from athletic events and practices at Price Park; and to connect the neighborhoods around Price Park to the regional trail system.

Having been selected for TAP funding, the Village will now pursue additional funding and partnerships



Police Hold Enhanced School Zone Safety Efforts Near Wolf Branch & High Mount

In the week when children were returning to High Mount and Wolf Branch school the Swansea Police Dept. participated in a campaign aimed at Enhancing School Zone Safety.

Due to an increase in the number of serious traffic crashes related to distracted drivers, like people using cell phones or texting while driving, the department feels it is critical that students be allowed to travel safely to and from school.

Swansea Police Officers teamed with Illinois State Police and all were highly visible in order to encourage safe driving and compliance. Similar efforts were underway


in other areas of the Metro-East area. The goal was not to issue traffic citations but to instead promote safety in school zones.

Specific unsafe driving habits that were being monitored included speeding in a school zone, passing a school bus while it is loading or unloading, seat belt violations, children not in child restraint systems, and the use of cellphones in a school zone, which is a more specific violation of law.

While the department posted large warning signs well in advance of the school zones, some drivers ignored those signs and so some tickets were issued.

While that again was not the goal, the Swansea Police Department cares deeply about the safety of children and many of the parents who observed the effort praised the department on its Facebook page.

through the Metro East Parks and Recreation District (MEPRD) and the St. Clair County Transit District, hoping to combine the resources of various entities to bring this project to reality.


The total estimated cost of the project including contingencies, engineering and construction phase services is \$549,861. The TAP grant requested 50% of that, or \$274,930.50, but the final award amount is still to be determined. Another \$100,000 would potentially be needed towards the development of a parking lot for the proposed trail head park on Boul Avenue, which is not grant eligible under TAP. Potential cost sharing from MEPRD or the St. Clair County Transit District has not yet been determined.

Creating a safer route for students was the initial

motivation for looking into a project like this. But connecting people more easily to the regional trail system is also very important. Swansea residents who live near a trail system connection are more likely to use the trails. And the proposed trailhead would also provide an access point

that should bring others from the region into Swansea, which may help boost some types of economic development.

By the time all of the grant processes are completed, construction is not likely to begin until summer of 2018.

Yard Waste Burning Prohibited Until Oct 4

A number of area municipalities completely ban the burning of leaves and yard waste. In an attempt to find some middle ground, Swansea allows this method of disposal during specific times of the year but only on certain days and times.

Any such burning is banned by ordinance until Oct. 1st. It will then be temporarily allowed through Nov. 30th.

However, the option is further limited to only on Wednesday's and Saturday's between those dates, and between 11:00am and 4:00pm on those Wednesdays and Saturdays. Any such fire must be completely extinguished by 4:00pm each day. Any burning must occur on your property, not along the edge of the



Village's streets, on the Village's right-of-way, or in any drainage ditch within that right-of-way.

Fires must be attended at all times and the Fire Department strongly encourages residents to refrain from burning on windy days when a small fire can quickly grow to be unmanageable and threaten your home and property.

There are other options available to residents. Republic Services offers yard waste collection for an additional fee (call 618 656-6883). Or residents can take yard waste to St. Louis Compost, located at 3521 Centerville Ave. in Belleville. Or residents can mulch or compost leaves on site.

Kyle Wallace Passes Wastewater Operator 3 Certification

Kyle Wallace, an employee in the Village's Wastewater Department recently passed his certification as a Class 3 Operator. Operators of

wastewater plants must be licensed by the state of Illinois and pass certification exams for Class 4 thru 1, with each level requiring additional years of experience before the exam may be taken.



Belleville Marathon Will Impact Traffic, Some Access to Homes

Saturday, September 30th, will see the return of a marathon race to the region, and the route of that race will have some impact on traffic and general roadway access in Swansea. The race will kick off in downtown Belleville at 7:00am and initially follow Main Street westward. It is planned to be concluded by 2:00pm.

Runners will cross 17th Street into Swansea at about mile marker 13.7 and do so onto Kingsbury Drive. Runners will then turn south onto Penrose and continue south onto Catawba before exiting Swansea back into Belleville. Based upon last year's times and average speed of the leaders, residents might expect to see the first wheelchair participants cross 17th Street at about 8:15am and the first on-foot runners around 8:30am. Those times are of course only rough estimates. When the last runner exits Swansea, will depend upon the pace of that one person. The number of runners and the concentration of their grouping will impact how long drivers might have to wait and how long some residents might be unable to get from or to their homes. Last year there were about 200 runners pre-registered for the event.

Drivers should note, this is a timed race that serves as a qualifier for the Boston Marathon. Therefore the race and their pace, is crucial to any runners who are trying to achieve that qualification. Race sponsors and volunteers will therefore be stopping traffic to provide right of way to any


runner crossing 17th Street, and will give preference to runners on other streets.

Any driver needs to be aware of that, remain patient, and obey the race organizers. Residents who live in Kingsbury, Penrose and Catawba should make plans in advance for ingress and egress that Saturday morning. Even if you are simply running some

Saturday errands, you would be well advised to check the map and determine routes you could follow that would not be impacted by the race.

And as an alternative, maybe consider coming to the race course at some point to cheer on those who are participating. Running or wheeling 26.2 miles is undoubtedly a challenge. We are sure those in the race would appreciate any support or encouragement Swansea residents are willing to provide.

Urban Way Repairs To Test New Approach

The Village recently awarded a contract to Christ Brother's Asphalt Inc. for work on Urban Way that will help the Village test a new approach towards repairing these types of streets. Urban Way is in the far northern area of Swansea, west of Rte. 159.

Like many of the streets in the northern area of Swansea, which the Village inherited by annexing that area in the 1980's, Urban Way is a concrete street with a monolithic curb and gutter. That means that instead of the curbs and gutter being formed and poured first, with the pavement lanes poured later and separately, the curb and gutter was poured and formed at the same time. This makes the curb and gutter integral to the pavement, and that potentially makes it more costly to repair.

And a lot of the concrete streets in this area are in need of repair. Concrete naturally moves, expands and contracts, and cracks as it cures. If timely saw cuts are not made to prompt subsurface cracking at specific locations, cracking will occur randomly. If the subsurface is not sufficiently prepared, it can fail to adequately support the pavement. Or if the trenches for storm water pipes, sanitary sewers, or other utilities are not backfilled with rock instead of soil, and are not adequately compacted, the trench can settle over time causing cracks.

All of these kinds of issues could be contributing to the condition of the roadways in these neighborhoods. The ideal solution would be to first

remove all existing concrete pavement, curbs and gutters, recreate and compact the subbase, pour new, separate curbs and gutters, and then pour new drive lanes. However, the Village lacks the funding to take that approach with all streets needing repair.

In addition, it would be ineffective to simply grind down the surface of the existing concrete streets and overlay with asphalt pavement, because the underlying cracks in the existing concrete roadway will typically reappear in the new asphalt pavement above.

So the Village will test an innovative variation on Urban Way. The plan is to grind the existing concrete surface but to do so more deeply along the edges, thereby segregating to some degree the curb and gutter from the pavement and form a subsurface crown in the center of the roadway to aid in drainage. The curbing will be patched as needed. Subsurface cracks in the original pavement will also be patched, helping to create a more stable subbase. Then a special fabric will be placed over the concrete subbase before new asphalt pavement is laid. In concept, this approach will hopefully prevent any subsurface cracks from reappearing in the new pavement.

The Village will of course monitor the roadway to see if the approach is successful. If it is, it should provide a lower cost alternative to complete reconstruction of concrete streets with similar cracking and failures.

Apply Now for Summer Usage Deduction

Swansea residents who do not use a deduct meter may still apply for a sewer bill credit to offset charges for water usage that did not enter the sanitary sewer system. This usage typically occurs during the summer with watering lawns, plants and filling swimming pools.

The credit is based upon the difference between the average water consumed on the first two bi-monthly sewer bills issued after May 1st, and the average water consumption reflected on the four bi-monthly sewer bills immediately preceding that same May 1st.

Fifty percent (50%) of the difference between the average consumption for the 'winter' and 'summer' periods is then subtracted from the user's actual water consumption on the next bill. Sewer charges are then calculated on the resulting balance.

To apply, complete the form to the right and mail or drop off as indicated. You must reapply each year, the deadline to apply is Oct. 15th, and you must have lived at the property for at least one year.

Those who use a deduct meter are allowed to deduct 100% of the readings through that meter.




